# **Community & Economic Development**

#### New Apple Store Building at Broadway Plaza

After one year of construction, the new Apple store building at Broadway Plaza received its Certificate of Occupancy (CofO) on July 18, 2018. Since the permit's issuance last July, the Development Service Team (Building, Planning, and Engineering) worked very closely with the contractors to expedite the approval process for field changes and to allocate appropriate resources to conduct timely inspections. Staff of three Divisions frequently met to have "one voice" on City requirements, and diligently coordinated with outside agencies (Fire, Sanitary, and PG&E). After learning of Apple's schedule for opening, the Chief Building Official organized three coordination meetings within a month to ensure that all project milestones were reached as scheduled.

Apple's grand opening is this coming Saturday, July 28.

#### Application for PG&E "EV Charge Network" Program

Transportation is the largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in California and in Walnut Creek. The Governor, in his State of the Union speech, forecasted that the number of electric vehicles (EV) on the road will increase from its current number of 350,000 vehicles on the road to a goal of 5 million vehicles on the road by 2030. The state is putting significant funding toward more EV charging infrastructure. Several automobile manufacturers have stated their goal to shift toward producing more, and in some cases only, zero emission vehicles in the 2020-2030 timeframe. In addition, the California Public Utilities Commission approved PG&E to launch a new "PG&E Charge Network" program that will install 7,500 EV chargers at workplaces and multi-family dwellings, and cover infrastructure construction costs. MCE is also offering an additional rebate to help offset the cost of the actual EV charging station.

City staff from CED, CMO, and Public Works have begun working on a plan to install additional EV charging stations at our own City facilities as part of our Climate Action Plan implementation and to prepare for the increasing number of EVs in the community. The PG&E and MCE programs are an opportunity to leverage the current funding allocated in the Capital Budget to install a greater number of EV chargers at City facilities. Staff are submitting an application this week to PG&E showing our initial interest, and we will work with their team to refine potential locations. The funds are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

## **Idle Free Outreach Update**

CED staff is continuing to conduct community outreach on how to be "Idle Free" to improve public health, improve air quality, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by not idling vehicles when parked. The Air District's Community Air Risk Evaluation Program has identified parts of Walnut Creek along the I-680 freeway and Ygnacio Valley Road as having higher levels of particulate matter and ozone pollution. The City's outreach is targeted to schools (children's health is more impacted by poor air quality), existing and new drive-up service businesses, and the general public. In April, staff highlighted taking a pledge to be Idle Free to employees and the community, and an Earth Day proclamation was made at City Council. In May, staff presented to the joint meeting of the City Council and Walnut Creek School District on upcoming outreach to schools. This summer, staff will be reaching out to public schools to encourage them to share Idle Free information with students and parents as part of their Back to School campaigns. Schools can access free resources online at idlefreebayarea.org, and the City can provide them with a free Idle Free Zone parking sign to install on school property. The summer issue of the Nutshell highlighted the Idle Free pledge to the public. In the fall, staff will work to contact our existing drive-up service businesses to make them aware of the Idle Free resources online, which they can share with customers. In addition, staff are exploring whether language can be included as a condition of approval for new drive-up service businesses that requires installation of a sign encouraging customers to turn off vehicles while waiting. ### **Public Works**

#### Walnut Ave. Ygnacio Canal Trail Crossing

The contractor for the Walnut Ave Ygnacio Canal Trail Crossing project will begin construction on August 6. The project is funded through a Transportation Development Act Grant through MTC and Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees. The project will make physical improvements to the trail crossing and add a pedestrian signal. The trail crossing will be closed to allow the contractor to make the improvements and notices are up on the trail now. The contractor's schedule estimates the trail being closed through the month of August and into mid-September.
